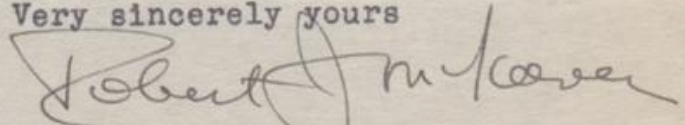
Dear Mr. Bonsels:
