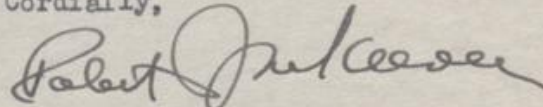
My dear Mr. Bonsels:

I was very happy to receive your note of acknowledgement and hope that yourself and Mrs. Bonsels enjoyed the Holidays. I am extremely sorry to learn that you have been ill and trust that your stay at the sanitarium will be beneficial.

Upon receipt of your letter I wrote to Miss Valerie Krauss and Professor Leopold and advised them that I would be glad to meet with them at a time and place mutually convenient. Miss Krauss has written to me about the certificates or documents of authenticity of the violins. Do you have such documents in your possession? I might say that when I took the violins to responsible and reputable violin dealers in New York City they requested certificates and bills of sale. Miss Krauss is apparently aware of the same problems that confronted me. You can appreciate, that in view of my profession, I do not wish to become involved in any customs problems in the event that I do not purchase the instruments myself. As a member of the Armed Forces I was entitled to certain exemptions, but I do not know what the situation is in the event that the instruments are purchased by someone else. I will take the matter up with the appropriate authorities so that there can be no question about the matter.
