Dear Mrs. Bonsels:

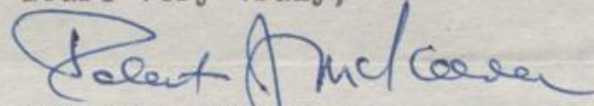
