I am all right again, after a slight attack of malaria. Temporarily on duty with Eighth Army. Living with the British -- a not unpleasant change.

It's a pleasant little thought that we are winning the war without any further delay.

What about our German-American anthology? We may as well decide upon a definite publication date.
