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See Your Chaplain

For the past five years he has been connected with the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Mount Calvary, in Los Angeles. From there he went to the Chaplains' School at Harvard University and upon completion of the five-week training course there he was assigned to Camp Crowder.

Chaplain Plueger speaks German fluently, although he has never been in Germany and was not in the habit of preaching in that language, except on special occasions. However, he is in a position to address the German prisoners in their own tongue from the pulpit of the new Prison Chapel, which will be dedicated next Sunday with a brief service.

In addition to the regular Sunday morning services, Chaplain Plueger plans to offer informal religious programs to the prisoners on Wednesday evenings, and he will be available in his office on other evenings for prisoners seeking spiritual guidance.

Moreover, Chaplain Plueger will hold regular Sunday services—in the dayroom, outside of the stockade—for the military personnel assigned to the PWC. The officers and enlisted men will also have the opportunity to come in contact with him at special evening hours.
