an editorial by Amk.
Mullit or Dorothy Thompson,
just out of sheer fairness
or for the sake of sensation
.... This was, incidentally,
another weakness of liberal
press in pre-Fascist Europe,
particularly in Germany

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The same mixture of curiosity,
business calculation, and
genuine "objectivity" - The
lithany work of Rathman's
introduction - praised in the
"Frankfurter Ztg." ; "Völkische
Rev." abusing Rathman, who
nearly happened to be a
great writer

Exaggeration - to other
directions, to want Dos Passos,
Rumson, etc. banished
Dunbar's ~~the~~ axiom - that
the "aim" signifies the
means ... ; common to
Nazis - communists.
But it is true that the
aim makes a certain
negotiation
necessary - Problem of
education - One of the
essential
problems of the night mixture
of force and persuasion
