- may be terribly near ...

Almost impossible to discuss anything but present crisis...the worst one among the varied we had to witness...Nobody can predict...As far as I am...renounced making prophecies...So many irrational elements involved; Hitler's abnormal character...
One thing one may say: WAR more likely than ever before; much more so than in September last year... *Situation imposed in many respects. The German.*
However - promised you to speak a few words about two books - one, published last fall; other in preparation...Books have to do with situation. Question of the "other Germany" becomes more and more crucial. Problem not: Will Hitler risk....? But rather: will Nation follow him....?
