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✱ The double danger - that we
sacrifice not enough - or too much.
There could be sacrificed too much
in both the practical and the
ideological sphere. Let's take the
two basic principles of peace and
liberty. It is not easy to come out
"for the war" for intellectuals who
have often ~~been~~ gone to record
with their abhorrence of war.
The formula of the "messiah"
will "is not likely to answer
public enthusiasm ... Yet, it
is the only formula at our
disposal: The war to defeat Hitler
is a moral evil - ("messiah")
not in the sense that it was
inevitable but that it has become
the only possible solution ~~since~~
certain appalling mistakes ...
Yet, we have the moral right, if
not the moral duty, to stress

rather -
upright "merit" more ~~emphatically~~ "will."
than the designation "will."
Also, we may point out that
progressive cons. quarters but
all this does not imply that
we are quite safe in the blood-
thirsty delight of fascist
war - glorification of slaughter...
Not for a moment must we
pretend that war is, after all,
only natural (it has always
existed and will always exist);
that the boys are going to
have lots of fun
War is not a natural thing
cons: during the present state
of modern civilization ... the
boys are not having a lot
of fun. War is hideous, boring
and incompatible with the dignity
of modern man. Moreover, it could
have been avoided Now the loss,
...., and now it has to be won.
Discipline - Freedom.
Concentration of power.
