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MANN TO MEN

Dear Editor:

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Coming back to Rome from a trip through parts of Germany and Czechoslovakia, I find in my mail numerous letters to my article, "Model City of Hate" (Theresienstadt), published in the Sunday Stars and Stripes Magazine of June 3. Most of these letters are from American soldiers who have, or had, relatives or friends in that Nazi-established ghetto town. Anxious to come in contact with their dear ones, or at least to obtain some relevant information, the letter-writers appeal to me — believing that I might be able to assist them in their efforts.

Unfortunately, I am not in a position to forward any communications to Theresienstadt, nor do I have access to any restricted sources of information. The only advice I can give to my correspondents is to approach the American Red Cross in Prague — directly or through the local Red Cross — or to address their questions to the Joint Distribution Commission (Intergovernmental Committee for Refugees), Via Umbria 2, Rome. A member of this organization, Miss Doris Guarino, has assured me that she would be happy to help as much as she can. The Commission, I am informed, has a complete list of all Theresienstadt prisoners up to January, 1945.
