(Goes to U.S.: Rockefeller Fellowship...)

The problem of national touchiness (the French are offended
because no abstracts from Fr. magazines...)

No Germans, Japs yet. (Looking for representative in Japan)
Two Russians -- through Soviet Embassy,
appointed by Academy of Moscow

Three sections already published. Reaction, satisfactory

DUTCH LITERATURE

Country, picking up... recovering... Indonesia compromise: the best that was to be hoped for...

Cultural life:

Music: Mengelberg -- out. Concertgebouw going strong -- with Bruno Walter and other guest conductors...

Painting -- no great discoveries...

Theatres -- quiet...

Literature -- lively...

Tragedy of small nations -- to be ignored by outside world. Exceptions -- like Scandinavia in late XIXth, early XXth centuries. Holland never could boast Ibsen, Strindberg...

A few figures of world reputation -- like Eduard Douwes Dekker (1820-87) ("Multatuli"), author of "Max Havelaar" -- epic exposure of colonial methods, more powerful than "Uncle Tom's Cabin;" and, more recently, Prof. Joh. Huizinga (1872-1945), historian and philosopher... ("the fall of the Middle Ages" "In the Shadow of Tomorrow"). But they say -- S. Vestdijk -- novelist, critic etc. -- would be A. Huxley, if he wrote in English; poets H. Marsman, Victor E. van Vriesland, J.C. Bloem, A. Roland Holst, J. Greshoff, Jan Prins are equal to Eliot, Valéry, Rilke, ~~etc~~ Yeats, etc. "une floraison poétique si éclatante qu'elle est à peine moins riche que celle de notre peinture au XVIIIth siècle."

Losses during the war --: Menno ter Braak, most talented critic, committed suicide, 1940... His friend Du Perron dies same year of heart attack. Born in Java, wrote "The Country of Origin," translated "La Condition Humaine" of his friend Malraux... Founded magazine "Forum" (1931), together with Jan Greshoff...

A. Roland Horst published "In Memoriam Menno ter Braak and E. Du Perron," under German occupation.

Clandestine literature -- "To my Jewish friends": literary public recognized voice of venerable poetesse, Henriette Roland Holst...

Poetry of Resistance -- popular, rhetorical, like in France (Aragon)

Underground magazine -- some of them now leading, like "Vrij Nederland." ... Profusion of ~~new~~ little magazines, typical of post-war periods. -- No "movement." *Kafka boom*... Also some new talents -- poets Bertus Aafjes (born 1914), author of popular "Voetreis naar Rome", now in Egypt with circus; woman, Vasalis -- more ambitious and sophisticated, considered great hope.

Publishers -- very active... New Donkersloot novel -- the international success?

If literary life suffers from provincialism -- scientific life all the more international...
