Dear Miss Landry, --

thank you ever so much for your note of April 23 including the stories that appeared in the Washington Post at the time of Mr. Eugene Meyer's death. Of course, you are quite right and I can draw from those clippings all of the information I need.

Unfortunately, however, there is still some additional information I need - and do need badly: When she left Zurich Mrs. Meyer carried with her a questionnaire I'd given her and which she'd promised to take care of as soon as possible. As it goes, that list contained quite a few questions which I should never have asked her, as it was easy enough for me to supply the answers myself. I am referring to questions of a general nature and not particularly connected with Mrs. Meyer or her work. It is concerning the latter that I proved to be rather helpless. Time and again my father in his letters refers to this or the other "article", review, letter to the editor and so forth and so on, and almost never am I capable of tracing the pieces in question. What I should have, then - in order to do justice to the "Agnes E. Meyer-letters" - would be a complete list including data (also, published where ?) of every thing Mrs. Meyer wrote and published on Thomas Mann. Should it not be possible somehow to get such a list composed for me ? Please rest assured that I am not being pedantic. But a proper edition of the letters just has to have these annotations and so I make bold and beg you to try.

Please give my love to Mrs. Meyer to whom I shall write very soon and accept my friendliest regards.
