thank you very much for your letter of March 25.
But there must have been some sinister - and in a small
way rather regrettable - misunderstanding. In your memo
to John Farrar late in 1957, you said that "it" (THE LAST
YEAR) will remain in galleys until May. It was also deci-
ded that the publication was not scheduled before August
1958.

And so - while realizing that the galleys I had been
sent were merely meant for me to place the illustrations,
I took it from the very beginning that I should be free
to suggest certain corrections as well.

I realize, of course, that since your plans regarding
my small books and its publication date have long since
been altered, no possible good can come from my modest pro-
posals. Once you've seen them, you may or may not agree
that this is a tiny bit of a pity. But then, as you accepted
the text as it was, I trust that everything will be well.
