As you know, volume II of my father's selected letters is to contain a great number of communications addressed to Mrs. Agnes E. Meyer. And as in the case of volume I we intend to use one handwritten page for the jacket in such a way that the handwriting would cover the whole front of the jacket, and the actual title (Thomas Mann Letters 1937-1947) would be superimposed on it. Now, this necessitates a very clearly written page, and excellent though the photostats are which you very kindly sent me, the particular page I have in mind isn't either clear or regular enough for this purpose. I am speaking of the first page of the letter of September 30th 1943 which begins "Liebe Gräfin Tolstoi".
